New worlds open as hearing begins

GIVING deaf people around the world an opportunity to hear is the goal of the Starkey Hearing Foundation.

Dr Nazanin Amini and Michael Zamani, of True Hearing Audiology - which has clinics in Camberwell and Hawthorn East recently travelled to Bali as part of the foundation's Asia-Pacific hearing mission.

The team helped hundreds of Indonesian adults and children with their hearing.

"The majority of patients we fitted with hearing aids were born with hearing loss, meaning that when we switched on the hearing aids, it was the very first time in their lives they'd heard their own voice and laughter and the voices of their parents too," Dr Amini said

The group established that for most patients, their hearing loss was only mild to moderate and not consistent with the need for signing.

"A whole new world of opportunity and communication has now been opened for these families. These sort of moments helped remind me why I love being an audiologist," Dr Amini said.

The foundation also offers a hearing aid recycling program. Used hearing aids can be dropped into the donation box at the True Hearing clinic at 1345 Toorak Rd, Camberwell.
